Answering the deputation, Mr. Ross said the municipalities applied for permission to cut the wood it would be granted them, to cut the wood it would be granted them, subject, however, to the regulations which are in existence regarding the stumpage dues. The cost of cutting the wood and freightage to Toronto would be considerable. The rate on the rallways from points between Gravenhurst and North Bay ranges from 5c to 6c per cwt. A cord would weigh 3800 lbs. making the freight from \$1.90 to \$2.25 per cord. In the present condition of the labor market, the wood could not be cut and hauled to the station for less than from \$2 to \$2.50 per cord. Then at the Toronto end the cost for delivery from station to yard or cellar would be approximately \$1 per cord. Thus the total cost would be from \$5 to \$6 per cord, beside the stumpage dues going to the government.


