TREATING CANADIAN THISTLES .- Our land is over-run with this pest, ret it is little regarded—not near so much as the dais yand some other plants. This is owing to the treatment, of course, for a thistle, eft alone or cultivated (and growing grain cultivates it), will grow so rank as to prevent all usefulness to the land. The mode here is the common mode of sowing to clover and grass seed. The first year the histles will grow rank, keeping down the clover. But cut when he stocks are hollow, or when the clover is cut, they will die or thrink away so as to be of little trouble hereafter, for the following seasons the grass will occupy their places and form a sod which seems to be a he grass will occupy their places, and form a sod which seems to be a guard against them.
