OTTAWA, April 11.—"Daylight saving is a matter for Parliament, and the board having no jurisdiction, cannot pass upon the merits of the issue one way or the other," says Sir Henry Drayton, chairman of the railway board, in a judgment handed down today.

Fellowing the judgment of the railway commission on daylight saving, Parliament this evening adopted local time for the sittings of the House. Just before the House adjourned, Hon. Arthur Meighen, who was leading the Government, rose and stated that the effect of the judgment was that the setting of standard or local time was a matter for provincial jurisdiction. That being the case, he suggested that the House, when it adjourned tonight, should meet again at 3 o'clock summer time on Monday.


