If a recorder refuses to receive an application to record, which he often does, the applicant has to go to court.

There are circumstances when a recorder might send an inspector to examine a claim prior to the hearing of a dispute.

The department will naturally say all these acts of the recorder may be brought before the commissioner upon appeal.

The question uppermost in the minds of the prospector and licensee of the land is, must applications for mining claims be subject to inspection before they are recorded or their dispositive effect is null and void?

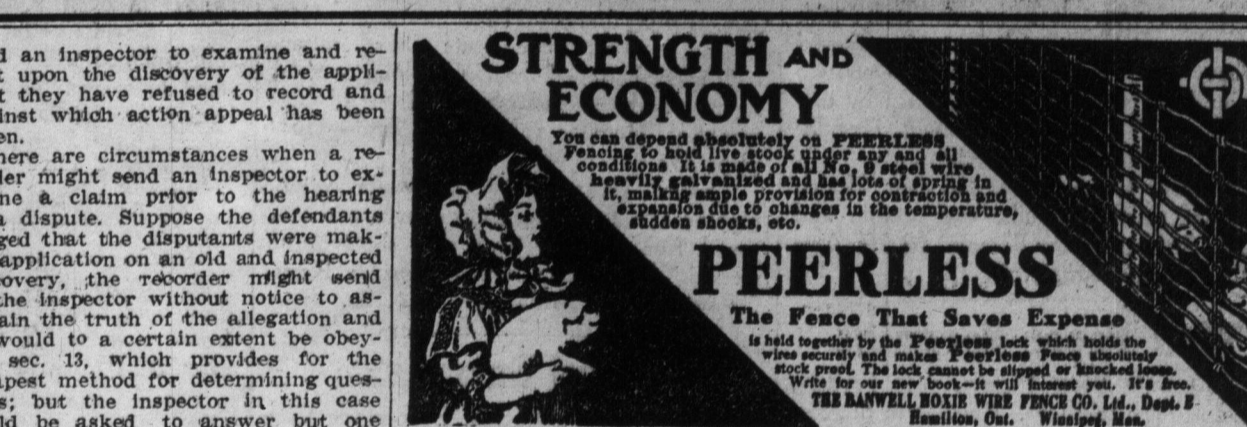
