Rules and Conditions for Triangular Course in the Bay.

The Royal Canadian Yacht Club's 14-

dingly race, open to all L.S.S.A. members, takes place Saturday, the following being the prizes, sailing instructions and conditions:

First prize: Sterling silver cup and to become the property of the winner.

Second and third prizes: Flags.

Sailing Instructions:

ditions: The race must be sailed
under the rules of the L.S.S.A., and all
entries must be under way before the
start of the preparatory gun.
Entries: All entries must be in the
hands of the secretary of the R.C.Y.C.
before Friday, June 2, 1910.
Official time: The official time must
be taken from the clock placed at the
bow of the R.C.Y.C. wharf.
