#### GREECE WILL BOW TO ALLIES' POWER

Definite Decision Not to Make War on Entente is Reached.

SULLEN SPIRIT SHOWN

Passive Attitude Toward So-Called Coercion is, However, Assumed.

London, Jan. 5.-The Greek government,

with former premiers, who agreed unantously that the note in its present form was not acceptable, inasmuch as compliance with the demands would be equivalent to admission that Greece contemplated attacking the entente forces on the Macedonian front from the rear, and also that there was foundation for the charges of unjust treatment of former Premier Venizelos' supporters.

Must Try Venizelists.

In regard to the imprisoned Venizelists, it is stated the king is ready to pardon some or all of those convicted, but under the constitution is unable to interfere with the judicial procedure before these men are tried.

The Athens despatch says that judging from the attitude of the entente diplomats the situation is not reassuring. The effect of the blockade is becoming more severe daily. Rigid control is being exercised of the distribution of breadstuffs. The bare necessities of life are now being sold at prices which are prohibitive to the poorer classes.

The demands of the entente, presented late last month, require an apology and other measures of reparation for the attack on entente forces in Athens and the establishment of control by the allies of Greek railways, telegraph lines and posts, and a large reduction in the number of Greek troops under arms.
