CONCERNING PEACE There is a very great difference be-tween peace and peace at any price. If we may judge from the utterances of some of the advocates of peace, they would be willing to accept it at any price, although when the price came to be paid they would undoubtedly be of quiet a different opinion. Such persona appear in regard an outburst of indigna-tion at stories of German brutality as evidences of depravity and of a general ly blood-thirsty disposition. Why can they not see that it is peace itself which is attacked by Germany, and that even a violent death with honor is better

they not see that it is peace itself which is attacked by Germany, and that even a violent death with honor is better than ignoble peace stained with dishonor. After all, the life of an individual or of a whole nation is not of as much im-portance as that honor he maintained in the world, and righteousness and justice become the guiding principles in the life of the race. Since there are such in-fluences in the world as that of Ger-man militarism they must be met and overcome in the only possible way, no matter what the cost to this generation, if the path of the coming generations is to be made more smooth and the triumph of right principles is to be assured. The right view of this matter is that ex-pressed by the cardinals, archbishops and bishops of Belgium and France, who contend that moral principles are binding on the consciences of all Christians. They ought to be equally binding on the con-siences of non-Christians, and where there is open and gross violation


