WILL HOLD BILLIARD WORLD TITLE TILT

Big Prizes For 3-Cushion Tournament Next Month in Chicago

NEW YORK, Dec. 2.—A world's championship three-cushion tournament will be held this season. Definite announcement has been made that the tournament would be held in Chicago from Jan. 31 to Feb. 14 and that ten players only would be eligible. The tournament will be conducted along lines similar to those in effect at the national championship pocket billiard tournament in Philadelphia last month. The tourney will be sponsored by Brunswick-Balke-Collender Company, who last month will contribute \$8,500 in cash to the prize money as well as rewarding the winner with a salary of \$200 per week. Each player will be asked to post a forfeit of \$100.

Silver Peso Slump Hits Mexico Trade

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 30.—The government is giving considerable study to the depressed business situation, which the newspapers described as a "crisis" precipitated by the slump in the value of the silver peso.
