BIG PAY ROLL DISAPPEARS; SAFE LOCK UNTOUCHED
Long Island city police are puzzled by the mysterious disappearance of \$29,000, the weekly pay roll of Rosenwasser Brothers, shoe manufacturers, from a safe in the Long Island City branch of the American Trust Company, some time between Friday afternoon and Saturday forenoon.
The loss was discovered when leader Kraushar, paymaster for the firm, went to the bank for the money, which he had placed in a steel box in the safe Friday afternoon. The safe was locked, but the steel box was missing. There were no marks to indicate that the lock had been forced. Kraushar and his assistant are said by company officials to be the only persons in the firm who know the safe's combination, and the paymaster told the police yesterday he had locked the safe's key in a vault at the Rosenwasser factory before leaving Friday night.
It was pointed out by the detectives from the Hunter's Point station that the money must have been abstracted before the bank was closed Friday or Saturday night.
"I have no idea how it happened," Mr. Rosenwasser said last night. "It is as mysterious to me as to any one else."
Mr. Rosenwasser and S. R. Berkow, the treasurer, who arrived at the bank immediately after they had been notified, joined in a statement immediately after they had been notified, to George F. Bahntz, manager of the branch, absolving the bank of responsibility for the loss. The shoe firm's safe was permitted in the bank rooms as an accommodation, being used to store by pay envelopes each Friday night.
WET AND DRY LEADERS TO DEBATE PROHIBITION
Washington, Jan. 22.—Wets and drys in the forefront of their respective movements will debate prohibition before the Economic Club at that association's annual dinner in the Hotel Astor, New York City, Jan. 25. Representative John Philip Hill of Maryland and Col. Ransom H. Gillett, counsel for the Association Against the Prohibition Amendment, will speak against "The Volstead Act and the Enforcement of Prohibition," while Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel of the Anti-Saloon League, and Dr. Harvey W. Wiley, former chief chemist of the department of agriculture, will defend the dry law and its enforcement.
