

THE HOSPITAL AID MAY PROVIDE SOCIAL SERVICE WORKER

The Women's Hospital Aid is contemplating maintaining a social service worker in connection with the General Public Hospital and at the meeting of the Aid yesterday afternoon in the board of trade rooms the superintendent of the hospital, R. COMMERCE GATES MUST BE OPENED

(Vancouver Sun.)  
Ten local organizations in Alberta have held annual meetings during the present month, and in each instance have passed resolutions of protest against existing conditions.  
The Saskatchewan Star published a letter suggesting that the three western provinces secure "complete political independence." The Regina Leader has also opened its columns to discussion of any proposed remedy for existing troubles.  
"The Toronto Globe takes the movement seriously, and deals with it in a carefully considered editorial, saying: 'If the Prairie Provinces should be formed either into an independent nation or a separate colony or dominion within the British Empire, that would only be a half-way house to political union with the United States. The nation or Dominion would have no independent access either to the Atlantic or the Pacific Ocean, and annexation would be the obvious escape from this isolation.'  
The west wants better markets, tariff reduction, lower railway rates and control of its own natural resources. These matters must be seriously considered by

political, difficulty in making a living on a farm when the farmer sells in a free market of world-wide competition; buys in a protected market, increasing prices not less than twenty-five per cent; and earns by comparison that his American neighbor to the south always has a decided financial advantage both in buying and selling.  
Arguments and explanations will not bring satisfaction. There must be a cash remedy in terms of dollars, and a removal of discriminations.  
The first necessary step is fortunately one which will not cost anybody anything, but, on the contrary, will make money for every industrial, agricultural, transportation, commercial and financial interest in Canada.  
This is to open the Pacific Gateway of Commerce; cut out the iniquitous Mountain Scale, which is really an insupportable tariff, preventing the western farmers from getting full value and quick returns for his produce by shipping to Pacific port. Doing this, and doing it now providing equal freight for equal service in respect of all freight traffic, will remove nearly all the trouble in Alberta and a great deal of the Saskatchewan difficulty.  
Prosperity on the Prairies will only come when the gates of commerce have been opened, and the most important gate of commerce is the Pacific Gateway. The real difficulty is financial, not
