C. P. R. AND DAYLIGHT SAVING.

C. P. R. AND DAYLIGHT SAVING. Owing to the decision reached by the large wholesale and retail merchants of the city to adopt daylight saving time, the times of arrival and departure of C. P. R. trains will revert to their orig-inal schedules. This will become effect-ive Wednesday, April 2. It means that the early morning train from Fredericton will arrive at 8.55 a. m. Atlantic daylight time. This train has been running one hour behind schedule. The afternoon local for Fred-ericton will depart at 5.10 p. m. and will make all the local stops. Suburbanites will now be able to use this train in-stead of going on the Boston and making special stops. All the other trains, that is the incoming and outgoing Montreal trains and the regular express trains for Boston, and all other C. P. R. trains in and out of the city will revert to orig-inal schedules. The same thing applies to the S. S. Empress between St. John and Digby.


