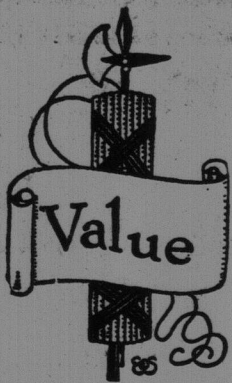

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WANT NO MORE LAND SOLD TO HUTTERITES

Lethbridge Veterans Demand Removal on Ground of Undesirables

Lethbridge, April 23—A deputation of the local branch of the Great War Veterans' Association waited on the Piling Land Company here, who sold the land to most of the colonies established last year in Southern Alberta, and demanded that officials of the company give their word to have no further dealings with the Hutterites.

Sharply worded resolutions have also been sent to Ottawa, demanding the removal of the present colonies on the ground they are undesirable citizens. Six colonies of Hutterites located in this district last year, buying thirty thousand acres for considerably more than a million and a quarter dollars.

Who the Hutterites Are.
The Hutterites, a sect which is now causing so much agitation, are not a nationality but a religious sect, opposed to military service.

There are only a few thousand of them on the continent. They left Germany originally to escape military service and went to Russia. When military service was enforced in the latter country they came to the United States, where certain undertakings were made to them regarding military service. Now they have peculiar modes of living, one of which is to reside in colonies of from eighty to 140, all under the one roof and around a common table.

DAME FASHION COMES BACK INTO HER OWN

Boston Easter Parade Like Those Before the War—Brilliant Colors Again Mark Gowns and Hats

Dame Fashion and all her family were on dress parade yesterday to honor the first after-the-war Easter. Dame Fashion was one of the many who suffered owing to the war, but now that it is over and the dove of peace is hovering near, her children have again rallied around her. Quickly she has changed the quiet, serious nurse, motor corps, Red Cross and war workers' uniforms into dainty frocks, gay suits, and hats which run to a riot of color.

The fashion parade to and from the churches yesterday outshone those of the last two seasons. Those who turned out were favored with a perfect setting in the bright sunshine and crisp, snappy weather. Last Easter and the Easter that preceded it found the wives, mothers, sisters and sweethearts of the boys over there giving their entire attention to the more serious side of life.
