N. S. AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE CLAIMS W. H. BRITAIN

New Brunswick Man, Well Known Here, Accepts Important Position at Truro

Halifax Chronicle—Dr. Robert Matheson, M. S. A., Ph. D., who has held the position of Professor of Zoology at the Nova Scotia Agricultural College and Provincial Entomologist for the province of Nova Scotia, has resigned to accept a position in original research at Cornell University. W. H. Brittain, B. S. A., at present entomologist and plant pathologist for British Columbia, succeeds Dr. Matheson and expects to arrive in the province about the 15th of October. Mr. Brittain is a son of John Brittain, D. Sc., formerly of Fredericton, N. B., and later of Macdonald College, Quebec. Dr. Brittain's work for the advancement of science, especially in the schools of the maritime provinces, is well recognized by all educationalists and his son, who will shortly join the staff of the Nova Scotia department of agriculture, has, ever since his early youth, been following the traditions of his father. Mr. Brittain's references are of the highest order, he having graduated with honors from Macdonald College and having later held an important position in the department of agriculture at Ottawa, and having for the past two years carried on most efficiently the duties connected with the position of entomologist and plant pathologist in British Columbia. When Prof. Cumming mentioned to Dr. Walter Murray, of Saskatchewan University that he was thinking of securing Mr. Brittain for the position vacated by Dr. Matheson, Dr. Murray said: "Secure him at once. I regard him as one of the most capable young men in his line in Canada."

SAYS CARSON POSES TO GAIN PUBLICITY; CANADA IS DECEIVED

Belfast Merchant Asserts Real Significance is Misunderstood—Industries at Stake

(Montreal Daily Mail.)

That Canadians are being deceived as to the true significance of recent happenings in the north of Ireland was the statement made by Edwin Johnson, prominent manufacturer from Belfast, who passed through Montreal last night. Mr. Johnson is engaged in the linen manufacturing industry in Belfast, and has a thorough knowledge of industrial and political conditions in Ulster.

"I was amazed, perhaps I might say shocked at the amount of space that the newspapers of New York and of Montreal are giving to the manoeuvres of Sir Edward Carson," he told a Daily Mail representative last night. "It appears to me as though more importance is being attached to them on this side of the water than the Irish and English people generally are disposed to give."

"There is a growing suspicion among

the better informed and less bigoted people of both parties that Sir Edward is posing for publicity and he certainly was pleased at the amount that he is getting here. Carson has by no means got an undivided Protestant Ireland behind him, no more than Mr. Redmond has an undivided Catholic Ireland to support his views." As for the talk of war to the knife should Home Rule be passed by the Commons, I do not think for one minute that the level headed business men of Ulster are going to allow their very industrial existence to be staked on the uncertain outcome of such a step, especially in view of the fact that they do not all of them see eye to eye with the present leaders of the so-called Provisional government, in their contentions.

"I am not a Ho-ae-Ruler," continued Mr. Johnson, "but I am not sure that a state of commercial chaos as would be brought about should Sir Edward Carson attempt to make good his threats, would not be a greater blow to the permanent prosperity of Ireland than a government directed from Dublin would be."
