

White Plague Fight Taken up at North Sydney Council Meeting

At the home of Mrs. R. L. Smith on Tuesday evening, a novelty shower was tendered Miss Bessie Smith by girl friends. She is soon to leave for the west to be married to Walter K. Whelpley, a former St. John boy.

At the last meeting of the North Sydney town council, Doctor J. K. MacLeod, city health officer of Sydney, and Doctor A. S. Kendall, county health officer, addressed the council in connection with the establishment of a county sanitarium for tuberculosis. Doctor MacLeod furnished the council with information regarding the mortality from tuberculosis in Sydney and the number of cases in the county and other towns of the county. The cost of the proposed sanitarium had not been determined, but would probably be between \$10,000 and \$20,000.

He suggested that a convention of representatives from all the municipal bodies of the county be held to discuss matters in connection with the erection and maintenance of the sanitarium. The mainmenance, he thought, should come out of the joint expenditure fund, and he gave an estimate of the additional amounts that would be levied on the municipality and the various towns for the purpose, based on the present contributions towards joint expenditure. North Sydney's extra out lay would be about \$1,300.

Doctor Kendall heartily concurred in all that Doctor McLeod had said. He briefly reviewed what had been achieved.
