#### WANTS EIGHTEEN MILLIONS FROM THE GOVERNMENT

Claims of Sir Charles Ross Arises From Expropriation of Rifle Factory in Quebec—Loss of Profits and Damages

Montreal, Nov. 26.—The Gazette prints the following from Ottawa:

Sir Charles Ross, Bart., is claiming compensation of \$18,897,724.08 for the expropriation of the Ross rifle factory at Quebec by the government of Canada and for consequent losses of profits on Canadian and imperial contracts. The claim, which has been presented in the form of a petition of right to the secretary of state, is made up of three items.

From these items totalling \$20,922,830.82, Sir Charles Ross deducts \$1,692,074.91, representing advances made to him on deliveries and \$343,081 paid him on account when the plant was expropriated, making the net claim \$18,897,724.

The writer pointed out that Germany must have an abundance of sugar, because most of the German sugar hitherto had been used as raw material for munitions and Germany now had a sugar harvest of about 1,800,000 tons, as compared with a normal consumption of only 1,200,000 tons. He said the potato supply also must benefit from the fact that it no longer was necessary to export spirits from potatoes for munition purposes.

"Even after the armistice," the writer said, "there is abundance of food in Germany for feeding the population if we reduce the consumption by animals by reducing the stocks of cattle. It is to be expected that food prices will soon fall sharply. The public can contribute to this end if it will avoid hoarding of supplies and wait for cheaper prices."

This section, it is alleged, the government violated by purchasing rifles from corporations other than the Ross Rifle Company.

APPLES AT 75c. A POUND.  
London—Good eating apples have been selling at 75c. a pound. The order fixing the price of apples of less than 2½ in. diameter at 16c. a pound is now in force, but after on account of the general dearth or the fact that fruiters are not satisfied with the profit to be made upon them, the 16c. apple is absent from the shops and stalls.

Inquiries for the chap fruit generally elicited the reply that there was none on the market. In one instance it was candidly pointed out that practically all the smaller apples had been hurried into London before the date of the order, so that a higher price could be obtained. In Farrington street a few apples were to be bought at 18c. and 20c. a pound, but their quality was poor. If the retailers persist in their refusal to handle the 16c. apple, and the fruit is withheld with a view to obtaining a higher price, it is possible that some of those with stocks will find themselves in the position of the retailers who refused to sell oranges except at an exorbitant price, and who eventually were forced to sell deteriorated fruit at 2c. each instead of the 10c. or 12c. they had previously demanded. It is suggested that if only the public would persistently refuse to buy apples at 75c. a pound the retailer would soon bring them down to a reasonable price.
