St. Johns, Nfid., June 2.-The American herring catcher A. M. Nicholson, of Bucks-port, Me., adrift in an ice flow all winter, sailed safely into Bonne bay yesterday. The iolson's crew abandoned her on January 29th, and made their way over the ice to Five Newfoundland fishermen boarded the vessel on April 5th forty miles from Bonne bay, and, after a trying experience of 57 days, four of the fishermen brought her 'nto port. The fifth had grown weary of the close confinement and left the vessel on May 29th and walked across the ice towards Portland creek. He has not been heard of since.
