Y., Feb. 18.—The National League adopted a playing schedule to-night calling for 154 games for the coming season, but it was accomplished only after a majority of the club owners had expressed their opinion that newspaper criticism over the delay was causing unfavorable publicity. Though the wishes of the American League for a 154-game schedule were met, that League's interests were disregarded when it was resolved to stretch the schedule out to October 15. The American League schedule terminates on October 9, although all league contracts with players up to the contract time.

CURLING RECORD A Most Exciting Spor.—Huat Arranged as

-Highland Society Cup. The Thistles and the Carleton clubs competed last night in the McCaffrey Cup series, two rinks on Carleton ice and two on Thistle ice. The West Enders were defeated by a score of 94

to 48.

In addition to the win by the Thistles, a rink on the Thistle ice skipped by A. D. Malcolm against one skipped by Harry Belyea, made a record which is today the current topic of conversation among the curlers. In the eighteen ends the Carleton curlers failed to make one score, while Skip Malcolm finished with a total of 43 points. The high score is not only a record but the fact of the opposing rink not scoring in eighteen ends is also said to be a record.
