owing to the high prices asked for stumpage, many of the smaller operators are holding off, declaring that at \$5 to \$7 per M. for permits to cut they cannot risk going into the wods. At the quoted prices of stumpage, taken together with the generally increased cost of operating, they fear that another slump in the lumber market would ruin them financially, and so they hesitate to make any move.

Within a year, spruce logs have sold as high as \$20 per M. on the Penobscot, but lately the price has declined, and \$17 is now the estimated value of the unsold logging that arriving.
