OTTAWA, 26th May, 1904:-

Sir,

With reference to the petition addressed to you by the members of the Mic-mac Band of Burnt Church, Northumberland County, N.B. in which they ask that the building lately erected on their reserve for a combined council-house and schoolhouse may be used as a dwelling for their missionary and assistant, I beg to say that the Department considers it advisable that the building should be kept for the purposes originally intended.
