LAURIE BROS.' TAMWORTHS AND POULTRY.

Some four miles from the Drumbo station is the farm of the Messrs. Laurie Bros., whose Tamworths are winning their deserved recognition in different parts of the province. In 1893 Lady Crampton 350, by Crampton Duke 1293 Lady Crampton 145 (imp.), was purchased from Mr. Andrew Dunn, and was on the farm four years, rearing two litters each year. One of her choicest daughters, Silk Down 651, by Briery Banks Hugo 167, is now a member of the herd, and is a very uniform, smooth, well-put-up sow; two years past and carrying her third litter. Her full sister, Miriam 652, also being in the herd, and falls short of her in size only, and also carries her third litter. Alice 401, by Elm Dale Monarch 83 (imp.), and out of Elm Dale Queen 83 (imp.), is three past and suckling her fourth litter of smart pigs to Sandy 3rd. Springbank Blossom 583, by Wolverton Chief 337, dam Birmingham Bell 419, is two past, and carrying a litter to Sandy 3rd 639, the promising son of the worthy Glen Sandy 17, and out of Mianie 455, which was purchased from his brother, Mr. T. W. Elliott, to head the herd, and from present indications he is fully qualified to hold that position. He was purchased not only on account of his individual merit, but his sire is regarded by Mr. Laurie as ranking among the first in the country. Sandy has a good amount of bone, is splendidly formed, and possesses a good disposition. Among the young stock our attention was attracted by a very choice four months sow out of Miriam, and four boars of the same litter that are exceptionally promising, possessing the true characteristics of the breed, possessing good length and depth, and of the thrifty, growthy sort, full of the requisite bacon quality.

The firm are also enthusiastic poultry admirers, and have on hand some fine specimens of the various breeds which they favor. The Plymouth Rocks were first obtained from Mr. Colwell, Paris, two years ago, the cockerel being of E. B. Thompson strain. The hens are of good size, even color, and nicely barred. The Silver Wyandottes were first obtained from Mr. Cox, Brantford. In Red Caps we were shown a choice pen of 14, a dozen from the pens of Mr. Hale, Board's Station, and one of the noted Shepherds family, while from the same noted breeders are a choice pen of Black Langshans that would be hard to equal, the cockerel of which was purchased from Mr. Jacob B. Snider, German Mills, and he is a beauty. The hens were secured from Mr. Taylor, Wingham, and are also lot, beautifully plumaged. Black Minorcas, Black Spanish, and Partridge Cochins are also represented, and none but the choicest of each breed and from the best breeders are kept for the supply of the pure-bred trade, which has largely increased within the last few years; a pair each of Toulouse and Embden geese, as well as a fine pen of Rouen ducks, which are in two flocks, accompanied by males from different noted breeders of showing reputations, are kept on the farm.

Taking the establishment as a whole, everything receives its proper attention, and nothing is overlooked that is needed to promote the interest and well-being of the stock in health and vigor.

FARM LANDS.

In another column of this issue will be found an advertisement inserted by Messrs. Oler, Hammond & Nanton, of Winnipeg, Manitoba, regarding lands for sale along the lines of the Calgary and Edmonton, and the Qu'Appelle, Long Lake and Saskatchewan railways. In conversation with these gentlemen our representative learned that they are well satisfied with the way the immigration season has opened this spring, and look forward to a very satisfactory settlement both in Manitoba and the Northwest Territories during the year. They state there is likely to be a large number of settlers going into Southern Alberta, where the construction of the Crow's Nest Pass Railway, connecting with the Calgary and Edmonton Railway at Macleod, has opened up a very desirable district for mixed farming or ranching on either a large or small scale. The Pincher Creek and Cardston districts will no doubt rapidly fill up.

Regarding land in Northern Alberta, these gentlemen spoke very highly of the Olds District, about fifty miles north of Calgary, as a very suitable one for mixed farming and ranching on a small scale. This district lies so near to the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway that it obtains the full advantage of all markets. Settlement in this district was started by a most desirable class of Americans, and the district is gradually filling up with a satisfactory class of settlers.

The prospects in North Saskatchewan are bright. Last year the district had a good crop, and good prices were obtained for everything produced. Prince Albert and Duck Lake are old and well-established settlements, though there is plenty of land still to be obtained in them, but a part of the country which is going ahead with a rush is the Roathen district on the line of the Qu'Appelle, Long Lake and Saskatchewan Railway, 200 miles north of Regina. There is already a very good German settlement established there, and the prospects are that this spring there will be a larger increase to it, and the Hague district lying immediately south, in both of which there is first-class land. Oler, Hammond & Nanton have lands for sale in all parts of Manitoba and the Northwest, so that intending settlers will not make a mistake in writing to them, no matter what part of the country they are going to.
