Ed. at L'Assomption Coll. and at McGill Univ., where graduated B.C.L. Admitted to the Bar, P.Q., 1877. Uumarried. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Conservative.—Montreal.

PERRY, STANISLAUS FRANCIS. (Prince, P.E.I.)

Descended from a French Acadian family. B. at Tignish, P.E.I., 1823. Ed. at St. Andrew's Coll., P.E.I., M., 1847, Miss Margaret Carroll. Represented Prince District in the P.E.I. Assem. from 1854, almost uninterruptedly, until Jan. 1874, and was Speaker of the Assem. from 1873 until 1874. He also sat in the Ex. Council of P.E.I. An unsuccessful candidate for Prince in the House of Commons, Sept., 1873. Returned to Commons at g.e. 1874; defeated at g.e. 1878. Reelected to the Ho. of Assem. 1879, and again at g.e. 1882 and 1886. Resigned 1887 and was re-elected to the Commons at g.e. 1887, and again last g.e. A Liberal.—Tignish, P.E.I.

Pope, Rufus Henry. (Compton.)

S. of the late Hon. John Henry Pope, M. P., who died Minister of Railways, April, 1889. B. at Cookshire, Sept, 1858. M., Lucy, dau. of Major C. Noble of Compton. Is a farmer and breeder of cattle. First returned to Parlt., May, 1889 to fill vacancy created by death of his father. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—Cookshire; Rideau Clab.
