Dear Mr. Meighen:-

I am sorry to trouble you when you are so busy, but inasmuch as you have frequently discussed with me an apparent lukewarm attitude of The Journal toward you, I think it but right that I draw your attention to two Government announcements in the morning newspapers that were strangely kept from me. The first is the announcement in Mackenzie King's personal organ, The Citizen, of the appointment of Justice Lemieux to carry on the Customs press; the second an announcement by the Mail and Empire of the date of the election. The Mail and Empire you may consider of more value to the Government than The Journal, but the preference to The Citizen rather puzzles me.

We are not asking for favors, but it is annoying to have rivals that are notoriously unfriendly and unfair to you handed the official news that you have to give to the public.
