
Ottawa, Mar. 3rd. 1916

Sirs-

In reply to your letter of the 26th ult., submitting the names of sixteen Indians resident on the Cockburn Indian Reserve, who are desirous of cutting a quantity of Spruce, Balsam and Palm of Gilead timber, as a means of relief, I have to inform you that a hard permit may be granted them for not more than 120,000 feet B.M. from off their Reserve, such portion of land being outside of the timber license area.

Dies at the rate of \$1.25 per M. Ft. on Spruce and \$0.80 per M. Ft. on the Balsam and Palm and is deducted from the purchase of the timber before it is allowed to be removed. It will devolve upon you to see that this condition is complied with.
