Honourable members will recall that a Conference for the conclusion of peace treaties with Italy, Bulgaria, Hungary, Roumania and Finland was held in Paris from July 29 to Schober 15, 1946. As Prime Minister and Secretary of State for External Affairs I had the honour of representing Ganada as Chairman of the delegation. The other delegate was my colleague the Minister of Matienal Defence; and as I was unable to remain throughout the entire Conference, Mr. Clauten became Chairman of the Ganadian delegation on my departure from Paris.
