

It was recommended that the Canadian delegation be authorized to support in general terms both the draft Convention and the protocol prepared by the ad hoc Committee, and a number of further recommendations were made for the guidance of the delegation.

An explanatory memorandum had been circulated.

The Cabinet, after discussion, agreed that the Canadian delegation to the Economic and Social Council be authorized to support in general terms both the draft Convention and the protocol, and approved the instructions for the guidance of the delegation, as submitted by the Secretary of State for External Affairs.

Korea; Canadian naval forces; imposition of censorship

17. The Minister of National Defence reported that the U.S. naval forces operating in the Korean theatre had imposed censorship and it had been considered necessary to impose censorship on the Canadian naval forces in that theatre of operations.

18. The Cabinet noted the report of the Minister of National Defence on the imposition of censorship on the mail of naval personnel in the Korean theatre.

Contract for construction of armoury at Sault Ste. Marie

19. The Minister of Trade and Commerce reported that the site originally chosen for the armoury at Sault Ste. Marie had been found unsuitable after a certain amount of excavation had been done. It had been necessary to select an alternative site which involved an increased expenditure.

20. The Cabinet, after discussion, noted the report of the Minister of Trade and Commerce on the increased cost of the Sault Ste. Marie armoury resulting from the change of site, and agreed that the Minister of Trade and Commerce negotiate with the construction company concerned in order to effect as satisfactory a settlement as possible.

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
