- Q Would five seres answer all their reasonable requirements?
- A Taking into consideration that it is for a fishing station, I think that would be very small it is rather difficult to answer that question because there are two rivers there and the Indians want these two rivers.
- MR COMMISSIONER CARMICHAEL: And to get these two rivers will require
- A I did not take any measurements.
- MR COMMISSIONER MCKENNA: In your judgment do you feel that there would not be sufficient security in giving them five acres to protect them in their fishing at these two rivers?
- I can only give a general reason it is a very important fishing place and I thought ten acres would be better for them than five acres; but as to their absolutely needing the ten acres I could not say.
- MR COMMISSIONER SHAW: You said that a cannery had a seining licence-
- A Yes.
- of the Indians get the ten acres would it interfere with the operation of the camery in fishing providing they could not land on the Indian Reserve?
- A I sould not reply to that question.
- MR. COMMISSIONER MCKENNA: Do the two rivers unite before emptying into the sea?
- A No
- Q Do the Indians' houses lie between the two rivers?
- A I think so, but I am not quite sure.
- Q Do you know whether the Indians use both rivers when fishing for
- A I think so.
- Q You conferred with the Indians in regard to this piece of land?
- A You.
