

Water Privileges as reserved by
the Indian Reserve and Commission
and Commissioners Spaw and O'Reilly
lying within the Canada Pacific
Railway Belt. B.C.

Readman's Creek Reserve - situated on each
side of Readman's Creek, extending along
the creek for about 8 miles, commencing
at its junction with the Thompson River.

* All necessary water for this Reserve
from Readman's Creek and its tributaries
and other sources. (28th July 1874)

and Lake Reserve. At the junction of the North
and South Thompson Rivers.

* All the water necessary for this Reserve
for irrigation and other purposes from
St Paul's Creek. (20th July 1874).

Res. No. 1. On the Right Bank
of the Thompson River including the land
between the river and Res. No. 1.

* All the water required in the Res. No. 1
by means of Res. No. 1 Lake and Creek,
subject only to the water requirement of
the Indians Lake Indians. (12 Aug. 1874)
