make no effort whatever now to recompense
the Jewish race for the great benefits already
received at their hands? Why should not the
Sovereign of the foremost empire upon earth
now cause a royal proclamation to be made,
calling upon British subjects everywhere to
favor as much as possible the restoration of
the homeless and destitute Jewish people to
"the land of their fathers?" and to contrib-
ute freely and liberally of their abundance
for this purpose; that they may have every
opportunity to attain to the highest cultiva-
tion of which they are capable; that their
country may soon become evidently
the fittest location upon earth for the
supreme international tribunal which shall
henceforth leave the nations neither excuse
nor occasion for war.

Benjamin Disraeli, late Prime Minister of
England, and hundreds of others of the
Jewish race, prove conclusively how
valuable Jewish people may become under
favorable circumstances.

So far from blaming Russia in particular
for the present condition of the Jews, the
nations of Christendom generally have good
reason to thank Russia for allowing the
millions of Jews a refuge in that country
until now, that the time has at last arrived
