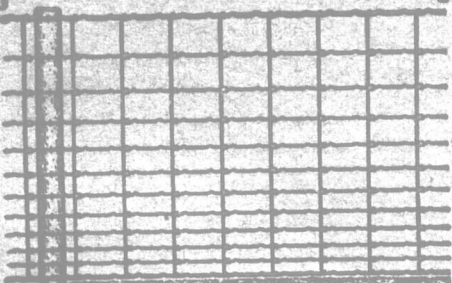

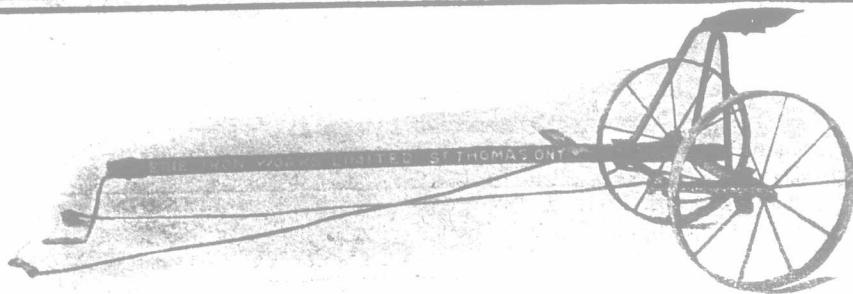

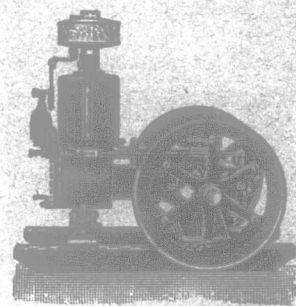


ST. THOMAS HARROW CART
