SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.



RAILS FOR HUDSON'S BAY. Ottawa, Sept. 8.—The Canadian government is calling for bids to furnish ten thousand tons of steel rails for the Hudson's Bay Railway. Bids will be received up to October 15.

IMPLEMENTS FOR WEST. Duluth, Minn., Sept. 5.—The biggest train load of agricultural implements ever shipped through Duluth passed through today en route to Winnipeg for distribution throughout Western Canada. It contains 46 cars of various kinds of agricultural implements. It was shipped by M. Rumely, of Laporte, Indiana, and is consigned to George A. Bross, of Winnipeg.

C. P. R. EARNINGS. Montreal, Sept. 5.—The traffic receipts of the C. P. R. for the week ended August 31, 1911, were \$3,329,000; same week last year, \$2,965,000, an increase of \$364,000. Mileage was increased to 10,542.

WALK ACROSS CONTINENT. San Francisco, Cal., Sept. 5.—John F. Mooney, 25 years old, a member of the New York fire department, arrived here today, having walked from New York in 81 days. His object was to lower Weston's time of 105 days across the continent.

SWAM ENGLISH CHANNEL. Deal, England, Sept. 6.—After a lapse of 36 years, Captain Matthew Webb's feat of swimming the English channel has been duplicated by William T. Burgess, a Yorkshireman. It was Burgess's sixteenth attempt, as he first attempted the feat in 1904. Burgess started from South Foreland, Dover, at 11.15 o'clock Tuesday morning. He landed at Lechatelet, a little village two miles east of Cape Grisnez at 9.50 o'clock this morning, accomplishing the passage in 22 hours and 35 minutes. A motor boat accompanied the swimmer.

CORN GROWING AT MORDEN. Morden, Man., Sept. 6.—The first corn harvester to come into Morden district arrived at Watson and George's implement warehouse this week. The machine is being bought jointly by four farmers living north of town and will be put to use at once. So far corn has not been sown extensively in this district, but the farmers are gradually learning the value of that great food product and it is expected large yields will be seen on the farms in this locality within a few years.
