to defray the extra expences of building a Goal in the faid City. One bundred and fifty pounds.

All which aforefaid feveral fums of money, fhall be paid by the Treafurer, by warrant iffued by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, or the Commander in chief for the time being, by and with the advice of his Majefty's Council of this province; and the receipts of the feveral perfons endorfed on the faid warrant, fhall be to the Treafurer good vouchers, and difcharges for fo much as fhall be thereby acknowledged to be received.

The Tresfurer to pay the aforefaid fums of money, by warrant illued by his Excellency the Lieut. Governor. Receipts to be endorfed on the backof the warrant.

II. And be it further enacted, That for anfwering the expences and contingencies, and extraordinary emergencies that ihall or may happen for the fervice of this province, to the first day of April, one thousand, seven hundred and eighty-eight, warrants may iffue for the fame on the Treasurer, from time to time, if drawn by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, with the advice and confent of his Majesty's Council, which the Treasurer is hereby ordered and directed to pay. Provided, the amount of the faidwarrants do not exceed the fum of *cne bundred pounds* during that time.-
