Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Ritchie, from the Committee, reported that after going thro's part of the bill, the Committee had directed him to report progress, and move for leave to sit again.

Ordered that the report be accepted and leave granted.

The order of the day being read, the House according thereto resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on a bill, " for the more speedy and effectual ad-" ministration of Public Justice in this Province, and for lessening the costs attend-" ing the trial of Causes on the Circuits."

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Johnston took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Mr. Johnston, from the Committee, reported that after going thro' a part of the bill, the Committee had directed him to report progress, and move for leave to sit again.

Ordered that the raport be accepted and leave granted. The House adjourned till this evening at seven o'clock.

The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Mr. Munro, by leave, presented a Petition of Aithney Cuthbert, & Co. praying that monies paid by them for transient duty on articles imported by them into Miramichi, may be granted to them.

Which being read, ordered that the same be received and referred to the Com-

mittee of Supply.

On motion of Mr. Stubs, resolved that a Committee be appointed to meet such Committee as the Honourable His Majesty's Council may be pleased to appoint, to prepare a most dutiful and humble Address to the King's Most Excellent Majesty and both Houses of Parliament, on the subject of a duty on Pine Timber!"

Ordered that Mr. Stubs, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Simonds, be a Committee for that purpose; and that Mr. Stubs and Mr. Johnston, inform the Council therewith

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning, at eleven o'clock.
