Duty on Wines, Gin, Brandy, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, imported into this Island"-was read a second time.

On motion, the said Bill was read a third time, and passed; and ordered to be sent down to the House of Assembly.

On motion, the Bill intituled "An Act to continue an Act made and passed in the First year of His present Majesty's Reign, imposing a Duty of Impost on Tobacco and Tea"—was read a second time.

On motion, the said Bill was read a third time, and passed; and ordered to be sent down to the House of Assembly.

On motion, the Bill intituled "An Act to provide for the better preservation of Public and Private Property at Georgetown, against accidents by Fire?"—was read a second time.

On motion, the Bill intituled "An Act to require Landlords and Claimants of Rents to put the Titles by which they claim upon Record, in the proper Offices of Record in this Island"—was read a second time.

Ordered, that a Conference be desired with the House of Assembly, on the subject matter of the said Bill.

Ordered, that the Honorables T. H. Haviland and the Attorney General be a Committee to manage the same, to meet in the Committee Room instanter.

A Message from the House of Assembly, by Mr. Owen, viz: "

"Mr. President,

"The House of Assembly do agree to a present Conference, as desired by His Majesty's Council, on the subject matter of the Bill intituled "An Act "to require Landlords and Claimants of Rents to put the Titles by which "they claim upon Record, in the proper Offices of Record in this Island"—and have appointed Mr. Binns, Mr. Owen, Mr. Green and Mr. Brenan a Committee to manage the said Conference.

"House of Assembly, 16th March, 1832."

Whereupon the Committee went to the Conference, and having returned, reported the substance thereof.

On motion, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole, on the Bill relating to Marriages—and after some time spent therein, the President reported, that the Committee had agreed to the same with Amendments, under the Title of "An Act to confirm and render valid certain "Marriages heretofore solemnized within this Island, and also to declare by "whom and in what manner Marriages shall be celebrated in future, and to "provide for the Public Registry of the same."

Ordered, that the Report of the Committee be received, and that the said Bill be engrossed.

On motion, the Bill intituled "An Act to prevent the running at large of Swine within the Town and Royalty of Princetown"—was read a second time.

On motion, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole, on the said Bill; and after some time spent therein, the President reported, that the Committee had agreed to the same.

Ordered, that the Report of the Committee be received.

Adjourned until 12 o'clock to-morrow.
