GAINED LITTLE BY GAS ATTACKS

Enemy Failed in Their Objective, Says Eye-Witness. London, May 31.—An account of the recent fighting in Flanders, written by the official eye-witness with the British general staff, under date of May 28, was issued by the Press Bureau to-day. It may be summarized as follows: Monday, May 24 witnessed a fresh development of the situation on our front. A violent bombardment with gas shells was started against the section of our line in this quarter, extending from a point north of Wietje. The Germans released gas from large numbers of cylinders along the whole line, and the gas continued to pour to the south-west for some hours in great volumes. This attempt to asphyxiate our men was, of course, preliminary to an assault against the salient, for which infantry had been massing in the east. The assault was carried out from three directions, being pushed forward under cover of a heavy bombardment. On the greater part of the front our troops were able to stand their ground, but in certain positions in spite of the poisonous fumes, but in certain sections they were forced to evacuate the trenches. German infantry succeeded in getting a footing in the front line of our trenches near the farm north of Wietje and for some distance astride the Roulers railway and south of the Menin road. The enemy lost considerably both from artillery and rifle fire. Counter attacks were organized that same morning, and by mid-day our infantry had succeeded in recouping its former lines north of the railway. By evening there were no Germans west of the original position south of the Menin road, though we were unable to recoupy our line in that quarter, as was the case also near Wietje. The advance of the enemy was stopped in the neighborhood of Hill 60.

RETOUCH TRENCH A party of infantry during the night worked its way by the use of bombs 40 yards up a trench which the Germans had taken, destroyed the enemy's barricades and reconstructed and held the trench. In the centre, near the Bois Grenier, a slight success was gained by our troops, who seized some ground. On Tuesday matters were more quiet along the centre. The Germans were active against certain points throughout the day. Near Festubert infantry carried a short length of trench by the use of bombs, but was forced by machine gunfire to give up part of it later. We gained three points south of Festubert and captured 35 prisoners. On Wednesday, May 26, there was no fresh development. On the night of May 25-26 we carried another small portion of the German trenches and captured a machine gun and one officer and 21 men. Progress was made during the day. The night of May 26-27 passed uneventfully. On parts of the front communication chiefly of a kind likely to be displeasing to the other side, is maintained with the enemy by means of signs. As instance of this, the Germans recently announced the success of the Austro-German armies in the Carpathians on a notice board, and the same means was adopted by us of informing them of the intervention of Italy. At this piece of news they showed considerable annoyance.

ABLAIN IS CAPTURED BY ALLIES

France's Young Troops Win Le Pretre Wood by Heroic Charge. Paris, May 31.—The report issued by the French War Office Sunday night announces the capture of Hill 17, near Pilken, on the right bank of the Yser Canal in Belgium, being part of the territory gained by the Germans in their great gas attack in the Battle of Langemarck. A counter-attack has been repulsed. North of Arras an attack by the French to the south-east of the important German field force known as the "Labyrinth" resulted in an advance of about a quarter of a mile and the capture of prisoners, including several officers. A group of German trench lines were also carried by the French in the forest of Le Pretre. A German attack against the Kopf, in Alsace, near Metzler, resulted disastrously for the enemy, who lost a trench in the course of the French counter-attack. HEROES OF THE CLASS OF 1915 The War Office made known Saturday night that the last German positions in the Bois le Pretre were captured at the point of the bayonet by soldiers of the class of 1915, who at the word of command dashed forward with utter disregard of their lives in a magnificent charge. A review of the operations which resulted in the final complete occupation of the Bois le Pretre contains the description of the last charge. It says that the fighting in this region has been continuous for seven months and was only terminated in victory by the bravery of the soldiers in question and the destruction of subterranean forts by artillery. The entire village of Ablain is now cleared of German soldiers. The battle has been a very hot one. The French on Saturday annihilated or put to flight three German companies.

COAL THAT SATISFIES

THEIR sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of not less than 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of land in the vicinity. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Late notice may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W.
