Wonders of Nature

Snail Can Live Indefinitely Without Inhaling Air.

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STUDY ONE'S OWN FARM

Soils Differ and General Advice is Not Enough.

The soil is the farmer's capital—his workshop. Upon it he focuses his whole business of farming, and upon its fertility will depend in large measure the success of the farmer's operations. Too often it is not given the proper care nor is sufficient intelligence exercised in its use.

"It is a remarkable fact that in India, one of the most arid countries in the world, there is a spot which has been said Dr. William Roberts, British agricultural expert in India. It is in the path of the monsoon and in a valley and there is almost constant rainfall, the average in the year being 500 inches or more. This seems almost beyond credence, but in fact it is true. The rainfall of the United States for instance, ranges from 16 in the driest to 112 in the wettest. It has been as high as 65 inches of water in a year, but this is the exception. During the rainy season, the rainfall is heavy, but in the dry season it is very light. Notwithstanding this, the district raises vegetables and grain. They do this by building terraces which carry the water off."
