The Exportation of Cattle

officers were always ready to give every information which was required. The St. Lawrence route was the best on this continent as it allowed shippers' time to get their cattle in good order before going to sea. He deprecated Canadians using American lines, contending that we owed no thanks to the Americans, who, when the rinderpest prevailed it England, placed vexatious restrictions on Canadian cattle; and even during the war, when their people wanted animal food, made us pay \$20 in gold for every \$100 worth we took across. Last year he had been one of a deputation to the Duke of Richmonu on the subject of the obstructions the English Government were placing in the way of the importation of Canadian cattle, and he had pointed out that in that way they were punishing us a second time for the disease which had preimportation of Canadian cattle, and he had pointed out that in that way, they were punishing us a second time for the disease which had prevailed in England, and from which we had suffered at the time. When the "Manitoban" was engaged, they understood they could place two board, but they found they could only get 189 into the steamship. Mr. Andrew Allen then allowed them to place 111 more on the "Waldensian," making 300 head in all which sold within eight hours after their arrival in Liverpool, and after paying \$15,000 expenses he had been enabled to bring back a very handsome profit. (Cheers.) He had already engaged the "Manitoban" for another trip, and was going to Montreal the next day to piepare stalls for the cattle he was taking with him. He had been also informed that he could have the ship following that, so that business could go on if the farmers of Ontario would provide them with the right sort of cattle. (Cheers.) The undertaking was in its infancy, but he had no doubt it would go on, and that for nine months out of the twelve every steamer that left Montreal would have from 40 to 260 head of cattle on board.
