Of all crops wheat removes the least potash from the soil, while mangels and turnips remove many times as much as any other crop.

Soda is probably not essential to the life of plants, but probably some such salt (sodium chloride) is if necessary, at least useful in the digestive processes.

Phosphoric acid is one of the most important mineral constituents of plants, especially of those used for food of animals.

These numbers show the extensive effect of mangels with regard to phosphates; they require more than twice as much phosphates as does any grain crop.
