COLDSTREAM GUARDS MAKING HISTORY

(Continued from Page Eleven)

At the Alma, when a center battalion was driven back, the Coldstreams stepped into the breach with the precision of troops at maneuvers, and when someone gave them the order to retire the battalion cried out, "No, no; that's a mistake," and Sir Colin Campbell furiously countermanded it. "Better that every man of her majesty's Guards should be dead upon the field than that they should now turn their backs upon the enemy."

On the soldier's day at Inkerman a Coldstream party at one point checked an entire battalion, and in a scramble later in the day, when the Guards were being up the fallen in numbers around them, Coldstream men were felling the foe like oren, and Chitheroe the boxer, was putting man after man to sleep with right and left on the point. "What shall I do?" cried out a youngster with a handful of men. "Hit the nearest head!" came the reply. But soon there was no one to hit. The British infantryman had made the heights of Inkerman his own. When the roll was called the Coldstreams had only four officers on their feet, and two hundred men down.

"Great Heavens, How they Fight!" To come to the end of the story, the fame of the regiment in alien lands takes no second place to others of the historic red line, now khaki colored, which from Tangier to Ypres has kept the flag flying.

The Germans know the Coldstream Guards well. The Prussian Guards know them too well. Where the Coldstreams have fought there the carnage lay and prisoners taken in the fight have exclaimed, "Great heavens, how the English fight. They never go back."

That famous institution of the Coldstream Guards, the Null Secundus club, was formed on March 4, 1783, and has doubled like a green bay tree ever since. The rules were that the members should dine together once a month, between the king's birthday in January and the queen's birthday in June. The cost of the dinner was fixed at five shillings, and the first course was to be on the table at 1; at 9 sharp the bill was to be brought up for settlement.

PRINCE WOOL MRS. LEEDS

Beautiful American Reported Engaged to Greek Royalty.

London.—The engagement of Prince Christophoros, a member of the reigning family of Greece, to Mrs. William B. Leeds, widow of the American tin plate millionaire, is reported. The prince, who is now in this city, is 28 years old. It is said the engagement is against the wishes of his family.

Since the death of her husband in 1908, when she inherited 14 million dollars, Mrs. Leeds has been reported engaged on many occasions. Mrs. Leeds has been courted and idolized by the marriageable title holders in Europe. She is noted for her beauty. Her husband, the famous artist, once declared she possessed ninety-eight of the hundred essential points of beauty.

By the marriage Mrs. Leeds would outrank any other American woman married to a title. She would become a cousin to King George of England and also to Victoria of Spain. The prince's sister-in-law, the queen of Greece, is a sister to the German emperor, and his father was a brother to Queen Alexandra.

In 1913, Mrs. Leeds was reported engaged to Count Tallyrand-Perigord, of France, a cousin of the Duc de Talleyrand, husband of Anna Gould. Previously her engagement to Lord Falconer, son and heir to the Earl of Kintore, was unofficially announced.

PULLED TEETH, BLED TO DEATH. A Score of Physicians Were Not Able to Save Montana Man's Life.

Great Falls, Mont.—Because of his unusual physique, structure that made him easily susceptible to bleeding, John W. Atkinson bled to death when he had his teeth pulled recently. Since 8th Atkinson had shown evidence of this peculiarity and slight abrasion would result in great loss of blood.
