In France the vertical system, introduced within twenty years, has grown into general favor and it is now obligatory in all the schools controlled by the State, and in most of the church and private schools.

McCrannley, of Rosthern, was returned by acclamation as member of Parliament for Saskatchewan riding to-day. The Sherbrooke Que., Feb. 6.—Dr. A. N. Worthington, Conservative, was returned to the Commons by acclamation for Sherbrooke to-day. He was the former representative, but the election was voided by the courts.

Pingle, who proposed to enter the field against him, without the endorsement of any organization, were irregular, and had to be thrown out as the signatures were not subscribed before a Justice of the Peace or the returning officer, as required by law.
