"Yes, of course," replied the witness. Falco Abramo Leonardo told a story the same as Mendola's and said he was immediately behind Mendola at the door.

William Noehol, sub-foreman, was working at the quarry and saw the Grecos running away. He yelled and they ran faster. He saw them later and started in to catch them and they ran away.

"Did you see these prisoners after they were arrested?" asked Mr. Washington. "Yes, Chief Twiss and Charles McCue and I went down there, and to the man, Bruno, I said, 'Bad job,' and he said, 'Not me, my brother.' The young one said to me, 'Just a little bit.'"

Mr. O'Reilly registered a strong objection against his own interpreter being called as a Crown witness. He said it was an outrage. The Magistrate allowed it to go, however.

The Magistrate immediately ruled McCue's evidence out, as this was a threat. Mr. Washington announced that the case was closed, and the prisoners had the usual warning read to them by Mr. Scarrone, but refused to say anything, and were committed for trial.

A point that will be raised at the High Court in connection with the trial is in reference to the confession which Budimir Protich claimed he got from the men. Mr. O'Reilly did not mention the point in Police Court, but speaking of it afterwards he said that Protich's evidence was worth nothing at all, as the law requires that the prisoners shall hear all the evidence. He spoke in English. This will also nullify Noehol's evidence in the case, he maintains.

New York, March 30.—Alex. Berkman, the anarchist leader, who served a long term in prison for an attempt to assassinate Henry C. Frick, was taken into custody by the police here to-day. He will be taken to Bellevue hospital this afternoon, and confronted with Selig Silverstein, the man who is charged with having thrown the bomb at the Union Square meeting last Saturday.
