War Savings Plan
And Penny Bank

The War Savings Campaign conducted throughout the schools has not, as some people imagine, had a detrimental effect upon the operations of the School Penny Bank. The deposits made by the children in the schools to the Penny Bank are on the increase especially among the school children of Ottawa as shown by the reports of March and April.

In the National movement to inculcate habits of thrift among the young people of Canada, there is room for the War Savings Stamp Campaign as well as for the Thrift Organizations of the Penny Bank. The one ably supplements the other and both work for the betterment of the individual and the Community.

Reports are being received daily at the Headquarters of the National War Savings Committee indicating how splendidly the War Savings Campaign is being taken up in the schools all over the country. The record of the savings of the pupils in some schools is most remarkable. One school in Cumberland County, N. S., where the average attendance is only seventeen (17), the total invested in War Savings and Thrift Stamps by the pupils up to the end of May was \$150.

Evidently the young people, with their keen appreciation of what is good, have realized the value of investing the value of investing their money in this new security of the Canadian Government and are showing the way to their elders.

Wall Street Journal
Approves of Metric System

SAN FRANCISCO, August—The voice of the Wall Street Journal has editorially urged the adoption of metric weights and measures by the United States. The Journal points out that this simple and logical system was favored by Washington, Jefferson, Madison and other statesmen, and that throughout the history of this nation public men and economists have urged the advantages of this simple decimal system of weights and measures. The Journal draws attention to the fact that one of the earliest orders of the war called for the adoption of metric units by Britannia and when the United States entered the conflict America followed suit.

"Perhaps the Anglo-Saxon aversion of change would be quickly overcome," declares the Journal, "were it generally known that our measurement by weights, ounces and quarts had its origin in Germany."

Weekly Agricultural
Report

CROP CONDITIONS

The hay crop is reported good on the Tantramar Marshes. Cutting is quite general in that section which produces a lot of hay and is later than other parts of the Province.

Generally speaking, the grain crop is inclined to be somewhat thin on the ground but is heading and filling well. In Carleton and Kings some oats are being cut. The quality will be good and the yield quite satisfactory, although not a heavy crop.

Potatoes on the whole are growing well and give promise of a good yield in some sections they are reported as being at a stand still and tops wilting down. While from other districts reports come of an excellent crop. Taking the Province as a whole, if nothing unforeseen happens between now and the harvesting time, there will be a good average crop in the Province.

Pastures are good for the time of year but are gradually becoming poorer with a consequent falling off milk production. Dairymen who have provided green crops for feeding are beginning to use them with good results. This practice is not general enough in the Province. It is the only way to keep up milk production when pastures begin to go down. Factories and creameries report a gradual falling off in milk production. So far the season has been good and the output for the year will be higher than last year. Creamery butter is selling wholesale at 50c. per pound.

Quite a number of lambs are going on the market. Drovers are offering \$6.00 to \$7.00 each for these on the hoof. In some sections they are being bought up at a lower figure.
