Mr. Webster anticipates a great rush to the districts west of Edmonton this year.

MOB SHOVELLED COAL INTO BAY AT CORDOVA

Excitement Over Government's Tardiness in Prosecuting Alaska Coal Lands Cases Climaxed by Riot in Which Prominent Business Men Took Head.

Cordova, Alaska, May 5.—The excitement caused by the government's failure to hurry action in the Alaska coal lands cases reached a climax yesterday, when three hundred business men and citizens, headed by ex-Mayor Chase and two councilmen, formed a mob, and, armed with shovels, marched to the dock of the Alaska Steamship Company and proceeded to throw several hundred tons of British Columbia coal into the bay.
