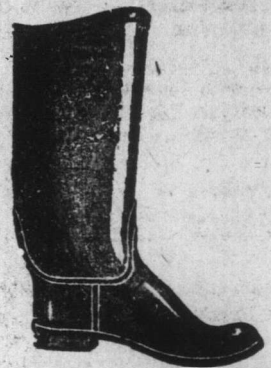


METHODIST EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGN.

MR. DUNBAR'S APPRECIATION.
Campaign Headquarters,
St. John's, Dec. 16, 1919.

Editor Evening Telegram.

Dear Sir:—On the eve of returning to Toronto, may I ask the courtesy of your columns to express appreciation and thanks to the people of St. John's, on behalf of the Salvation Army and myself.

This is my first visit to the country and has been interesting and enjoyable beyond my expectations.

My first attraction was the Island itself and the many remembrances of the Old Country it stirred up. But the greater attraction was the people, because of their openhearted and hospitable reception of a stranger and their kindly co-operation with him in a good cause.

The people of St. John's and the country generally have reason to be proud of the success of the Maternity Hospital Campaign. It was achieved after two large Campaigns had already been run in the same year and at a time when three or four other Organizations were actively soliciting funds, and moreover, in the middle of the Christmas season.

The total amount raised up to date is \$94,000.00 but the whole \$100,000.00 aimed at is assured and the whole amount promised is pledged for payment within a single year, and instead of only one quarter of the amount as expected being in the Bank, one third is already there, and the first quarters payment from the largest contributors still to be received, which will make quite \$50,000.00 on hand.

In short, in face of apparently impossible conditions a body of christian citizens, representing all Churches and acting from pure and unselfish motives, has again demonstrated the truth of the word which says, "Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit saith the Lord."

People of wealth, the middle classes, working people, young people and even the sick and very poor have united in contributing to the success of the movement. As a result the community will have an Institution which will be of incalculable service to its needy ones.

The Advisory Board which consists of representative citizens of all Churches will work together to establish and maintain the Hospital in a way which will commend itself to the whole Dominion. This is the best pledge of the certain success of the enterprise.

To all, who in their great kindness co-operated with us to make this great success possible, I desire to tender my most grateful thanks and with every good wish for a Merry Christmas.

WINDSOR PATENT

Ye Olde English

Christmas Cake Recipe !

INGREDIENTS.

"Windsor Patent" 3 lbs. (to which add 3 teaspoons Baking Powder.)
1 lb. Fresh Butter.
1 lb. White Sugar.
2 lbs. Seeded Raisins.
2 lbs. Cleaned Currants.
1 lb. Citron.
1 lb. Sweet Almonds.
1 dozen Eggs.
1 teaspoon Allspice.
1 teaspoon Cloves.
2 tablespoons Cinnamon.
2 Nutmegs.
1 glass Wine.
1 cup Molasses (with the spices in it).

DIRECTIONS.

Steep this gently 20 or 30 minutes—not boiling hot; beat the eggs very lightly; put the fruit in last, stirring it gradually, also a teaspoon of SODA dissolved in a teaspoon of Water. The fruit should be well floured with "Windsor Patent"—it necessary add flour after the fruit is in.

Butter a sheet of paper and lay it on pan. Lay in some sliced Citron—then a layer of mixture—then of Citron again, etc., until the pan is nearly full.

Bake three or four hours in a tolerably hot oven and with steady heat.

Let it cool in oven gradually.

Ice when cold.

MILLEY'S

Pro Patria Reaches Port.

Came into North Sydney Under Her Own Steam.

North Sydney, Dec. 13.—The overdue steamer Pro Patria, arrived here under her own steam at six o'clock this morning, short of coal, short of provisions, and after having been adrift at the mercy of the terrific storm of Thursday for 14 hours because of engine trouble.

The captain and the members of the crew report the trip to have been the worst in their experience. When the storm was almost at the height of its fury the engines went out of commission and for fourteen hours the steamer was pitched about helplessly in the terrific sea that was running. When finally the engines were again in working shape the Pro Patria was still unable for some time to make headway, so fiercely was the storm raging. Her difficulties were increased by the fact that the vessel on this trip was comparatively "light."

Finally, the steamer was able to make slow progress toward port. When she docked this morning, she still had a few tons of coal to spare but had been at sea for a very short time longer fuel would have been completely exhausted.
