### Tank Claim Fails

JUDGE'S COMMENT ON CAPTAIN

Judgment for the Crown was given by Mr. Justice McCardie in the £300, 000 claim by Capt. Bede J. F. Bentley of St. David's, Church End, Finchley N., who contended that he was the originator of the British Army's war

tank in October 1914. Capt. Bentley said it was at Lord Kitchener's request that he devised the idea of the tank; that, when he discussed the matter at Lord Kitchener's private house in Carltongardens, a promise was made that his financial interests would be protected; and that he did not take out a provisional patent as the project was
