regular semi-monthly meeting of the W. C.
T. U. Tuesday afternoon, Mrs. (Rev.)
Ira Smith gave an exceedingly interesting
and applicable Bible lesson on "The Op-
pression and Deliverance of the Israelites."
One new member was received. If the
services of Mr. Volney B. Cushing, one of
the noted American temperance workers
of the day, can be obtained for Dec. 12,
it would be a most interesting and in-
structive meeting. The meeting will be
held at 3 p.m., the usual hour of meeting.
Favorable reports of work done were
given, and several requests were made for
more workers, which met with a partial
response, and still there is a demand for
more.

For some time the question of having a
library of temperance books for the assist-
ance of superintendents of departments and
members of the union has been under con-
sideration. Tuesday's sum of money
was granted towards this purpose. It is
believed there are those who will gladly
contribute a suitable volume to this col-
lection, and thus assist to overcome a long-felt
want.

The county and also the Provincial "Plan
of Work" was read, discussed and adopted
so far as it concerned local union work.
It was announced that Rev. Mr. Hector
(the Black Knight) would commence
another week's campaign in this city on
Dec. 3, and all members were urged to do
everything in their power to make these
meetings a success. These meetings will
