ADDITIONAL RECIPES.

Tea "Dainties."—Take two cups of powdered sugar, half a cup of butter, a cup of sweet milk, the whites of four eggs, a teaspoonful of lemon extract, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, and flour enough to make a soft batter. Beat this batter hard for ten minutes before putting into heated patty tins. Bake quickly and allow to cool, then ice with soft icing made from whites of eggs mixed with enough powdered sugar to make it stiff.

Anise Drops.—Beat a cup and a half of sugar and three eggs together for half an hour and add a pint of oil, a half a teaspoonful of anise seed. Grease pans with beeswax, drop spoonfuls of the mixture upon them, and bake quickly.

To Hang Up Coat and Skirt Properly

It is a long cry from the days when women hung up their coats and skirts, when they were travelling. They like to hang their skirts upon the flat wooden clips that men use for trousers. The skirt is folded carefully at the waist into the exact length of the clips—the clip is slipped over these folds, the fastener pulled down tight and the skirt is perfectly and securely hung. On return from town with its dust and dirt, coat and skirt are well whisked before being thus hung up, so that they are ready to be donned at a moment's notice. Only in 16 ways can a tailor-made be kept fresh and smart and shapely. But the hangers are necessary for all sorts of dresses and waists, and for these it is pretty to cover the hangers with cotton wool by way of padding, and then to cover this again with ribbon or silk shirred on, and finish off with a bow. If desired, a little sachet powder may be sprinkled into the cotton wool.

The Child's Diet

From Eighteenth to Twenty-Fourth Month.

BREAKFAST.
1. Juice of sweet orange or pulp of six stewed prunes or pineapple juice (two or three tablespoonfuls).
2. Cereal (as cream of wheat, oatmeal, farina, hominy grits) well cooked and served with milk (up to 16 ounces), may be slightly sweetened or butter and salt added.

FORENOON.
Milk with toasted biscuits, or swieback or crackers.
DINNER.
1. Broth or soup made of beef, mutton or chicken—may be thickened with peas, farina, sago or rice; may take beef juice with stale bread broken into it, or clear vegetable soup with yolk of egg in it.
2. Soft-cooked egg (boiled, coddled, shirred, poached).
3. Glass of milk or milk toast.
4. Dessert—Apple sauce, baked apple, prune pulp, lady fingers, graham or arrowroot crackers; rice, bread, tapioca, custard, blanc mange puddings, baked custard, junket, or rice with top milk and little sugar.
SUPPER.
Milk (cold or warm), custard or prune pulp or apple (baked or in sauce) or rice or stewed fruit, swieback or bread or crackers.—Prepared by New York Milk Committee.

Some Don'ts for Hot Days

Eat pork or any other "white meats." Eat much meat of any kind. Drink alcoholic beverages. Let the milk stand in the sun several hours before taking it in.
Keep the milk in the bottle it comes in, empty it into a pitcher or stone jug and put it in the icebox.
Break up ice to make ice water. Let the water cool in the icebox. Ice is likely to be full of dirt.
Run for that car. Take the next one.
Keep looking at the thermometer. Overlook the advantages of frequent tepid baths.

After reaching the age of one month, children derive much benefit from sleeping outdoors in the daytime. This should be encouraged when weather will permit. In the summer time baby may start this happy habit.

One of the most surprising novelties of the season is the hat covered with white velvet rose leaves directly in the centre of the front. The effect is certainly unusual, yet it is not as striking and white checked gingham, which poets have lauded in many a verse. It covers many of the large, new, picturesque shapes, but is most successfully used on a large shepherdess shaped the entire hat, even the brim, being covered with a Delft blue and white plaid gingham. The crown is encircled with wide, white moire ribbon, prettily draped in black, where it ends in huge upstanding loops.
