Personal Health Service

(By WILLIAM BRADY, M.D., Noted Physician and Author.) The Specialist and the Anhedonia. Anhedonia is that incapacity to enjoy life which is characteristic of every individual who has not attained health plus. The particular anhedonia we are now discussing is splanchnic anhedonia, which is the kind that makes the victim of ptosis or sagging of abdominal organs so glum.

Now perhaps the worst thing that can happen to the splanchnic anhedonic is to discover that his stomach is two inches below his navel and that his color is away down in his pelvis or that his kidney is floating about like a derelict. To discover this appalling fact, I mean, by means of an X-ray examination and then to be left dangling there between the threat of an operation on the one hand and some dire eventuality if operation is rejected on the other hand.

As a matter of solving truth, a great many of us, particularly those of us who have the corset and skirt wearing habit in the worst way, to wit, tight around the abdomen or hung from the waist, have floating kidney or gastroptosis or sagging colon or loose liver and never suffer anything worse than just anhedonia, just not getting the fullest measure of happiness out of life.

Oh, you ought to read some of the enthralling chapters of Sir Arbuthnot Lane on the beautiful train of physical, mental and moral shortcomings lingering on some such visceral displacement or the intestinal stasis and stagnation and the resultant epidemic of toxæmia that accompanies this stagnation. You'd enjoy it, provided you haven't ptosis yourself.

Nowadays there are a lot of incompetent braggarts to all branches of medicine. Among them are X-ray specialists or technicians who pretend to diagnose disease conditions by means of X-ray observations or pictures, although they are the parser, bore out the stars proper training in anatomy, physiology, pathology or diagnosis. These ready X-ray experts may understand how to manipulate the X-ray apparatus perfectly, but when they interpret the observed conditions or the X-ray pictures they are going too far, and they do much harm to the public. It is the sheerest folly for any layman to go off his own X-ray, since the X-ray expert for diagnosis, no matter what the trouble may seem to be. Scarcely a day passes that some unfortunate victim of this absurd modern fad does not mail me the X-ray, films or findings, for which he has squandered good money, as though I could or would reply upon any such frail evidence in arriving at an opinion or a diagnosis. The X-ray examination is part and parcel of the medical examination, in some cases, and should be carried out, if at all, only by special direction of the patient's physician.

Dodging the Draft. Kindly tell me, when a window is open whether the fresh air comes through the top since the bad air goes out through the bottom, or vice versa. (E. M. E.)

ANSWER—Theoretically the warm inside air rises toward the ceiling and so escapes out through the higher opening, and the cooler outside air enters through the lower opening to take its place. This is the nice, lady-like arrangement made and provided by old fossils who pin their noses to the window-board. Practically more or less foul warm air leaves both at the top and at the bottom; and more or less cool outside fresh air enters through both apertures. Rev. H. O. Eastman is ordained at Arkona. Young Pastor Will Go To Bolivia As Missionary Shortly.

[Special To The Advertiser.] ARKONA, June 1.—At a largely-attended service held in the Baptist Church here last evening, Rev. H. O. Eastman, who will leave on July 15 to commence missionary work in Bolivia, was ordained.

The meeting this afternoon was called by the pastor, Rev. A. H. Jones, and following Scripture reading by Rev. William Johnston, Rev. A. C. Bingham of London led in prayer. Robert Crawford, clerk of the church, then read the minutes of the previous meeting. A council, composed of 72 members, representing 27 churches, was formed and proceeded to organize. Rev. N. S. McKechnie of London was appointed moderator, and Rev. A. C. Bingham secretary. The minutes were read and approved by the council. The new pastor was asked to give a statement regarding his call to the ministry, and his doctrinal beliefs. "The council, by a unanimous vote," decided to fully fellowship Mr. Eastman.

Among the visiting pastors were Rev. H. E. Stiiwell of Toronto, Rev. A. B. Reekie, Barrie; Kerr of McMaster University, Hamilton, and Rev. E. B. Jones, and R. C. Eastman, a brother of the candidate.

At the evening meeting Rev. N. S. McKechnie was chairman. The Scripture reading was by Rev. E. B. Reekie, and prayer by Rev. Wm. Johnston, and Rev. T. Doonille of Forest. Following selections by the ladies' quartet, a sermon by Prof. Kerr, a solo by Mrs. Ed. Dickson, the ordination prayer was made by Rev. Wm. Johnston of London. This was followed by the laying on of hands and the fellowship of the Baptist ministry and missionary body was extended by Rev. E. B. Reekie, who was the pioneer missionary to Bolivia. The ordination certificate was presented by Rev. A. H. Jones, and on behalf of the Rev. E. B. Reekie, Rev. A. C. Bingham presented Rev. H. O. Eastman with a pastoral check. The new pastor then closed the service with the Benediction.

STRIKE AT HAMILTON. HAMILTON, June 1.—Because some non-union men were put to work, the union bricklayers, carpenters and plasterers employed at the Ontario Hospital for the Insane in air rebuilding of the Orchard House wing destroyed some time ago by fire, quit work this morning. The program of swimming events for the next Olympic games was drawn up. The international Olympic committee met here today, and it was expected that before adjournment it would select the city where the next Olympiad will be held.
