ENTRIES ARE LARGE

The exhibition of sheep at this year's Fair easily outstrips anything formerly attempted both in numbers and in quality. DISPLAY OF ANTIQUES
IS FEATURE AT FAIRSt. Thomas Dealer Wins
Praise of Visitors With
Fine Exhibit.

As a delightful change from the sight of scores of modern appliances and machinery that turns out finished products at record speed, the visitor to the Fair should visit the display of English and French antique furniture, in the Manufacturers' Building. This exhibit, the property of Mr. McCullum, antique dealer of St. Thomas, is attracting record crowds, not alone because it is unique, "unexpected," one might almost say, but because the pieces are uncommonly beautiful. In the background stands a magnificent French marquetry cabinet with ormolu mounts, and on side of it, a rosewood table inlaid with scrolls of brass. The center foreground is given over to a charming rosewood sofa table, surrounded by English walnut ladies' and gentlemen's arm chairs and dinner chairs. Several pieces of Sheffield plate and old rock crystal complete a particularly fine exhibit, whose attraction is proving one of the features of the new building that houses it.

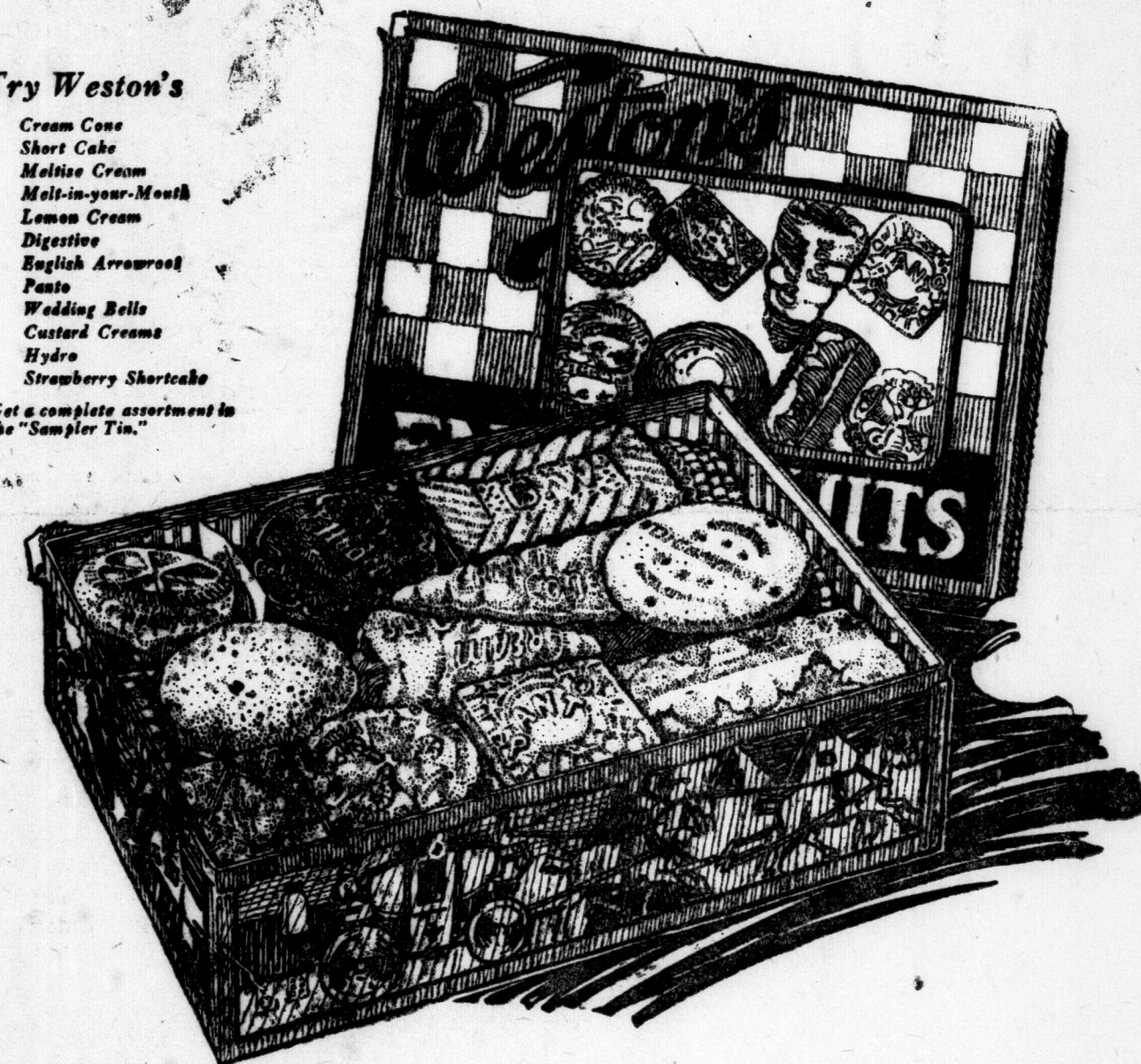
