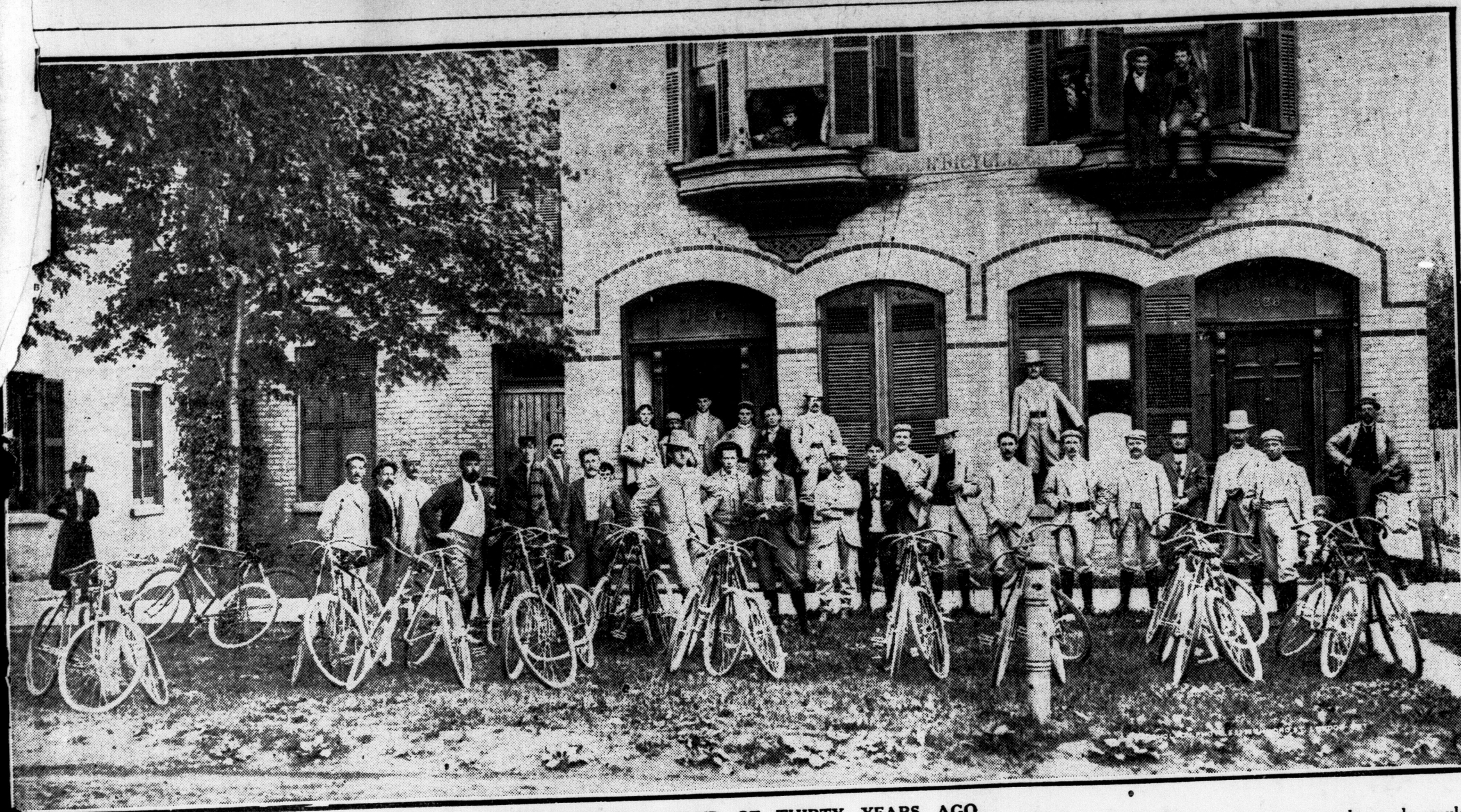


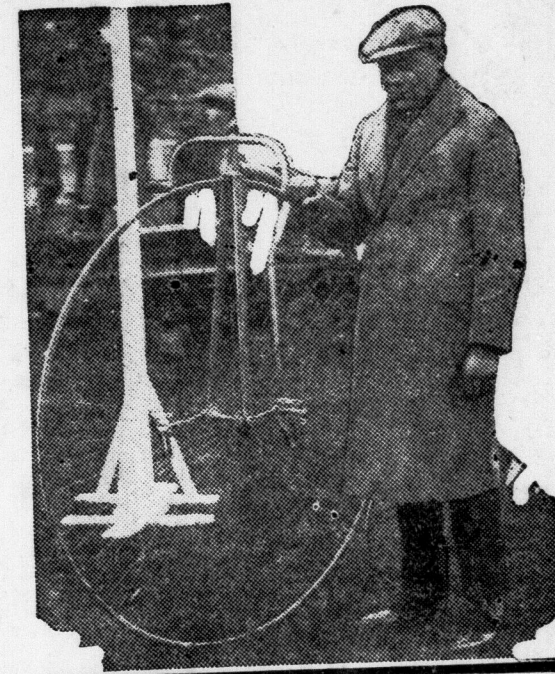


LONDON BICYCLE CLUB OF THIRTY YEARS AGO.

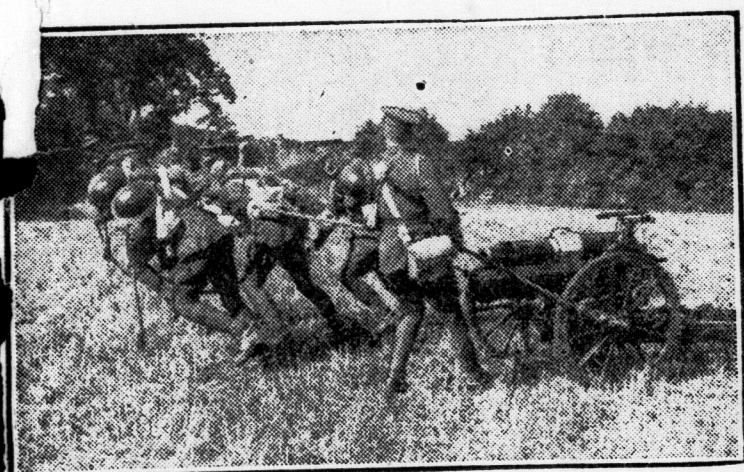
The above picture, taken in June, 1895, are some of the members of the London Bicycle club of that time. The club had a membership of nearly 200 cycling enthusiasts who made regular trips to neighboring towns and cities. A favorite trip used to be Port Stanley via the Wellington road. This picture was taken in front of the club's headquarters, 326 Dundas street, opposite the armories. Shown in the picture are: (Left upper window), Miss Tye, formerly superintendent of Victoria hospital; (right upper window), from left to right), Charlie Tambling, Billie Tambling and Fred Beltz (captain); standing at left, in white coat and cap, A. R. Bayley, well-known London lawyer, W. R. Jarman (manager of Forest City Laundry), J. Goodwin (formerly chief despatcher for London division of the old Grand Trunk; fourth from left, J. Nicholson, photographer, with beard; Ed. Struthers (in uniform), well-known native Londoner, now a resident of London and president of the International London Old Boys' Association; at his left, Lieut.-Col. C. M. R. Graham (cap back on head); Bert Screation (high hat, center foreground, hand on wheel); Frank Edy, photographer (arms folded); directly behind Edy, in derby hat, Sid Screation; next to Sid Screation, at right of window, James Belton (high white hat); Ed. Croden (high hat, standing on window sill against shutter; E. Rechnitzer, front row, dark uniform, with letter "L" on sweater; at his right, Tom Baker, wholesale jeweler, white hat and black sweater; at his right, E. A. White (white coat and cap) of George White & Sons; Jerry MacDonald, proprietor of the Iroquois hotel; third from Baker's left, directly behind Jerry, stands Bert Glover, well-known marksman; next to Glover, Oliver Leslie; and the good-looking young man in bicycle togs at the extreme right is Sam Stevely, former mayor of London and a real cyclist of the late nineties. Some names have been omitted because of inability to secure accurate identification. Do you know any of the others?



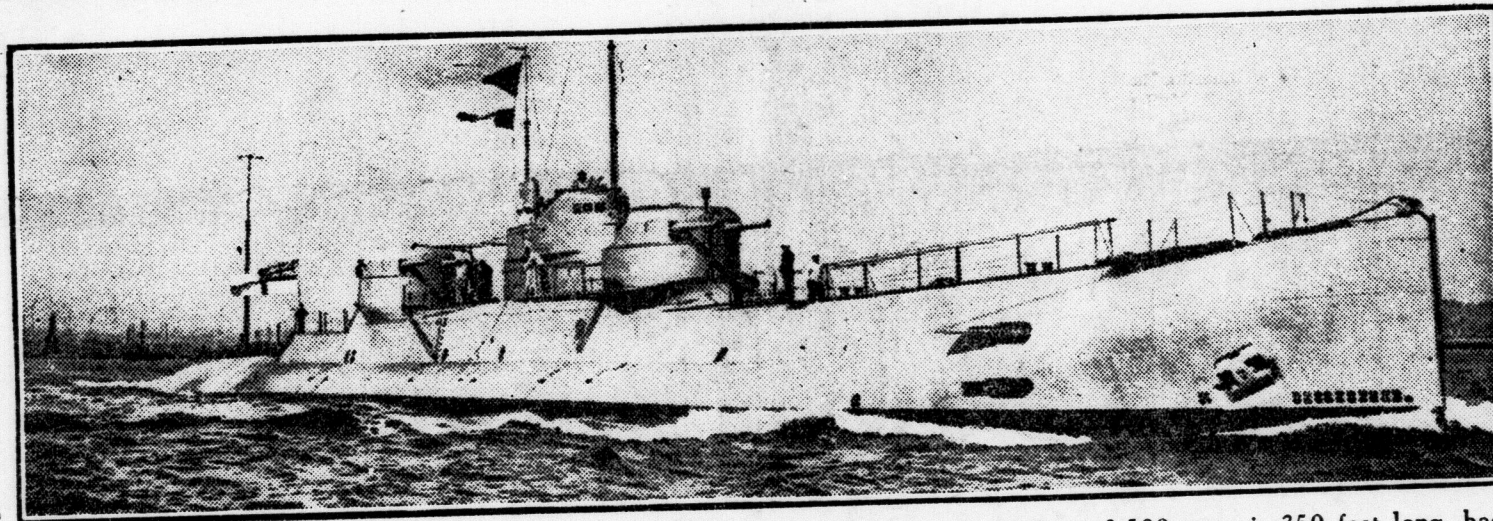

Hauling a new light gun at the Hampshire manoeuvres.

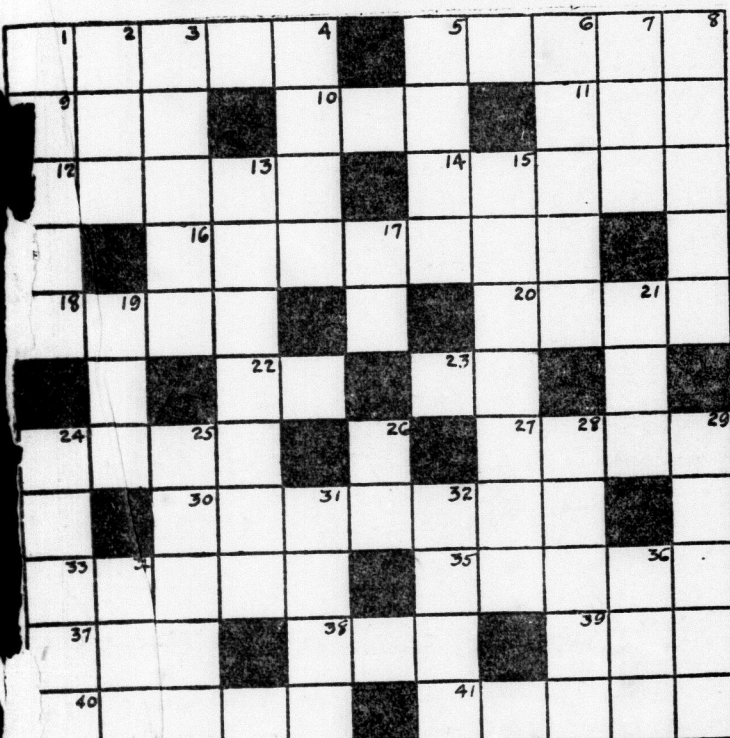

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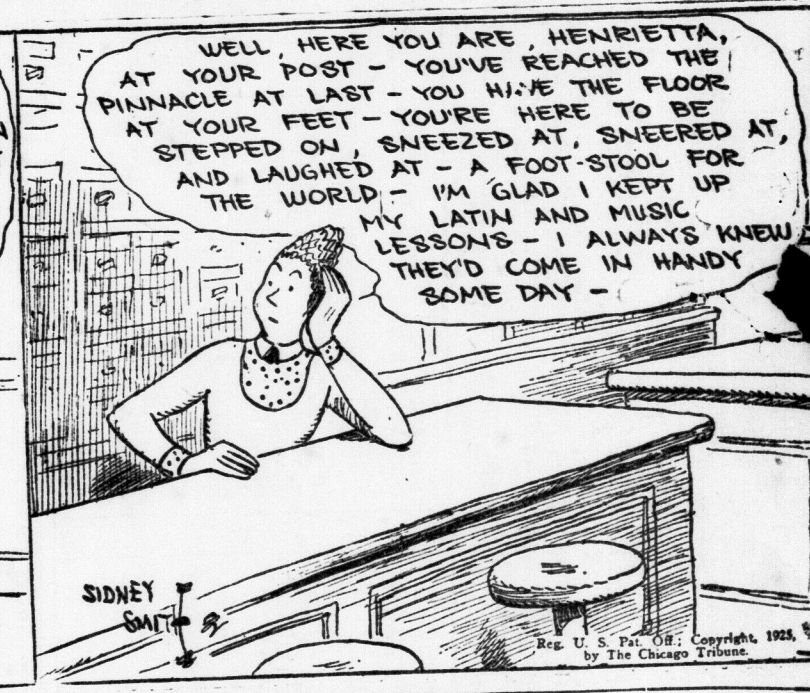
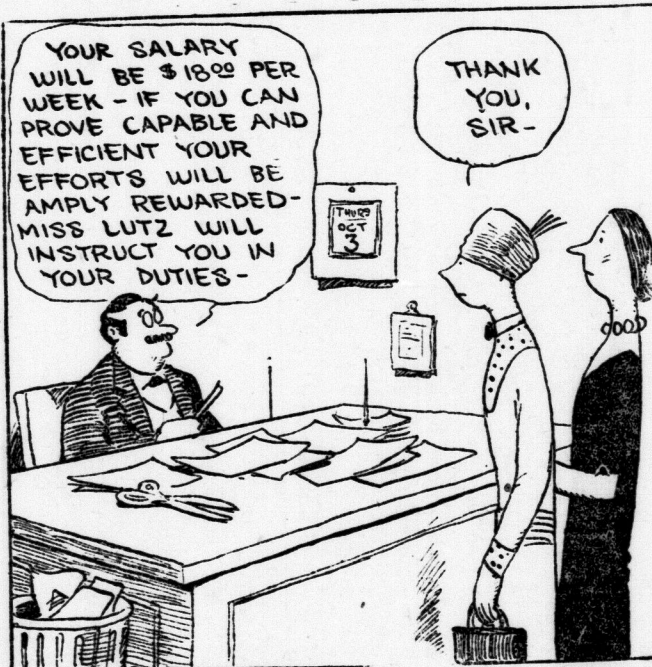
