WAR IMMINENT.

Guatemala's Reply Unanswerable Except by Hostilities—Strongly Hostile Feeling. Secretary Gresham Expresses the Hopes of President Cleveland for an Amicable Settlement. CITY OF MEXICO, Jan. 25.—A telegram has been received at the United States legation here from Secretary Gresham, expressing President Cleveland's hope that Mexico and Guatemala would agree upon some favorable means of settling the boundary dispute between themselves, or failing in that would agree upon a reference of the controversy to friendly arbitration. This message has been transmitted to President Diaz.

TORONTO TOPICS.

TORONTO, Jan. 26.—(Special)—A howling gale, the worst of the season, accompanied by snow, struck this province from the northeast last night about ten o'clock and continued without abatement until ten o'clock this morning. In this city about a foot of snow fell on the level, and it being a heavy wet character the street railway traffic was almost entirely suspended until well on towards noon, while all the incoming railway trains were three to four hours late.

WINNIPEG WIRINGS.

WINNIPEG, Jan. 26.—(Special)—Bell's brewery at Fortage la Prairie was totally destroyed by fire this morning. It was an isolated building distant from a fire tank. The owner, James Bell, estimates his loss at \$15,000, insurance, \$8,300; \$2,000 of which was in the Eastern and \$2,000 in the National of Ireland.

JAPAN'S DETERMINATION.
